Financial barriers

Inadequate allocation of budget for research and development and dependency on international aid.

The solution:

Allocating more budget

Solution:

Cultivation surfaces

The goal of Rooftop gardening

Places to exploit unused rooftops in urban household needs for the production of vegetables and fruits, medicinal and aromatic plants as well as fish production for domestic consumption or increase the family's income













- 1-The exploitation of neglected space for food production.
- 2-Production of basic needs of vegetables and fruit.
- 3-Increasing green space to increase oxygen and inhaled pure and clean air.





Obstacles cultivation rooftops

- Residents fear the houses of the size of the loads on roofs.
- The owner of the building control surface where the vast majority of residents in cities.
- Costy expensive.





- The lack of a large collective participation of neighbors in a unified work fairly combines all on one goal
- Higher basic costs for the establishment of agricultural systems on rooftops, where most people prefer to get ready systems instead of training and learn how to create them and how to exploit the available waste and trash or in the environment around them.





 High prices of seeds and seedlings, especially hybrid vegetable seeds can be replaced under the conditions of cultivation surfaces seeds of varieties of vegetables in the open field that may be high -quality production or less, but what is needed to meet them.





 Non-availability of fertilizers or nutrient solutions for crops planted on rooftops in the shops and limiting the availability of the source or two, resulting in hardship to have it as a big part of the success of such cultivation due to the fertilization process

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
